New Madison Square Garden Pictures

ZIPPIN PIPPIN Roller Coaster Story goes on...

Another update on the famous Rollercoaster loved by Elvis which has unfortunately been mothballed for some time now.

The mayor of Green Bay, Wisconsin, says his city wants to buy the Zippin Pippin for it's historic Bay Beach Amusement Park. Mayor Jim Schmitt, in Memphis on Monday February 8th to see the vintage wooden roller coaster at its Libertyland site, did not disclose a purchase price, but said that most of the money Green Bay pays would go to relocation of the roller coaster. Schmitt said last week that re-engineering the roller coaster in Green Bay would cost



"well over \$1 million." "We're impressed," Schmitt said after his early morning visit to the Zippin Pippin. "We've talked to our engineers, and this can happen." Schmitt said he would begin negotiating with Save Libertyland Inc. and Mulroy in the hopes that the roller coaster would be operational in Green Bay in May 2011. He said preparatory construction work could begin as early as June or July. "This is a wonderful opportunity for both of our great cities, and we are hopeful that it will lead to something of great mutual value and benefit for all of our citizens," said Memphis Mayor A C Wharton, who met with Schmitt Monday morning. Schmitt said the Zippin Pippin fits perfectly with his city's historic amusement park, a "family-friendly" park which features 25-cent rides and is slated for expansion.

Mike McCarthy, a filmmaker creating a documentary about the decline of Libertyland and the Zippin Pippin, and an officer with Save Libertyland, said he was happy that the roller coaster is getting a new home. "It's awesome," said McCarthy. "Let it go to a city that respects history and culture."

Elvis—The Concert 2010

For those of us heading to Glasgow's SECC for the concert on March 6th, I found this interesting review of the opening concert which took place in Sheffield. It was written by Mark Nicholson.

I have just returned home after seeing the opening night of the 2010 tour. The introduction was quite spectacular, different and exciting compared to previous tours. The alternate 2001 theme (as heard in Elvis On Tour) kicked it off. "ELVIS" was projected onto the white curtain hiding the stage, then "SHEFFIELD" appeared beneath it. We then saw the Planet Earth and it zoomed down towards the UK, then towards Sheffield (via Google Earth?), then towards the venue itself. The footage continued with the doors of Sheffield Arena being opened (By now the "proper" 2001 Theme had kicked in...) The footage used at the Memphis 2007 show of Jerry and Joe with the guy in the Aloha suit then followed, as did the projection of "Elvis" walking across the stage. Then the curtain fell away...

The TCB band (minus Jerry) were all in attendance, as was Joe Guercio, The Sweet Inspirations and The Imperials. Nathan East was a marvelous substitute for Scheff - he seemed to be having a ball up there. Following Elvis' introductions of the musicians and vocal groups, the screens gave way to Joe Guercio who introduced Nathan...

Although the stage set up looked much snazzier than on previous tours, song-wise it was pretty much business as usual with no new startling additions as far as I could tell. There were a few technical difficulties and on some of the TTWII material featuring the 1950's songs the band were not quite "with it" tempo-wise. That said, it was still a great experience and those of you with tickets for the remainder of the tour are in for a treat... Just relish the experience of that opening sequence!
